1:00 PM **Equivalency Credentials Towards BCC: The Certificate in Hindu Spiritual Care**

In January 2022 Chinmaya Vishwavidyapeeth (University) in Kerala offered the first instance of their Certificate in Hindu Spiritual Care designed to train Hindu spiritual care providers to work in various institutional settings supporting Hindus in India and the US. In 2023 Chinmaya International Foundation (CIF) became the umbrella organization. Accredited and recognized by the Association of Professional Chaplains (APC) for credits towards earning Board Certification, this is a landmark program in spiritual care. Program Director Smt.
